PACTS-UKIS HISTORY

PRINCESS ANNE COUNTY TRAINING SCHOOL

was the first and only high school for "colored children" in Princess Anne County, Virginia, which is now known as Virginia Beach.

- 1926: The *Princess Anne County Training Association*, the county's African American parents, communities, teachers, churches, and community organizations raised money to purchase property to build a high school to provide better educational advantages for African American children in the county.
- 1934: A temporary school site was established on the property of the Black Union Baptist Church, located on South Boulevard in the vicinity of present-day Mt. Trashmore.
- 1938: On the corner of Cleveland Street and Witchduck Road, a four-room building was completed in 1938.
- 1949: Construction started in 1949 at Princess Anne County Training School, and the additional space included four new classrooms, a cafeteria, and lavatories.
- 1950: According to the Princess Anne County School Board Minutes in 1950, a 15-acre site adjacent to the training school was purchased to build a new high school for "Negro children."
- 1953: The high school addition was completed in 1953. Among the new features were 14 classrooms, an auditorium, one home economics room, and a gymnasium.
- 1962: Princess Anne County Training School later expanded in size and was renamed Union Kempsville High School in 1962.
- 1969: Union Kempsville High School closed after citywide integration of schools started in Virginia Beach. *The last class graduated in 1969*.
